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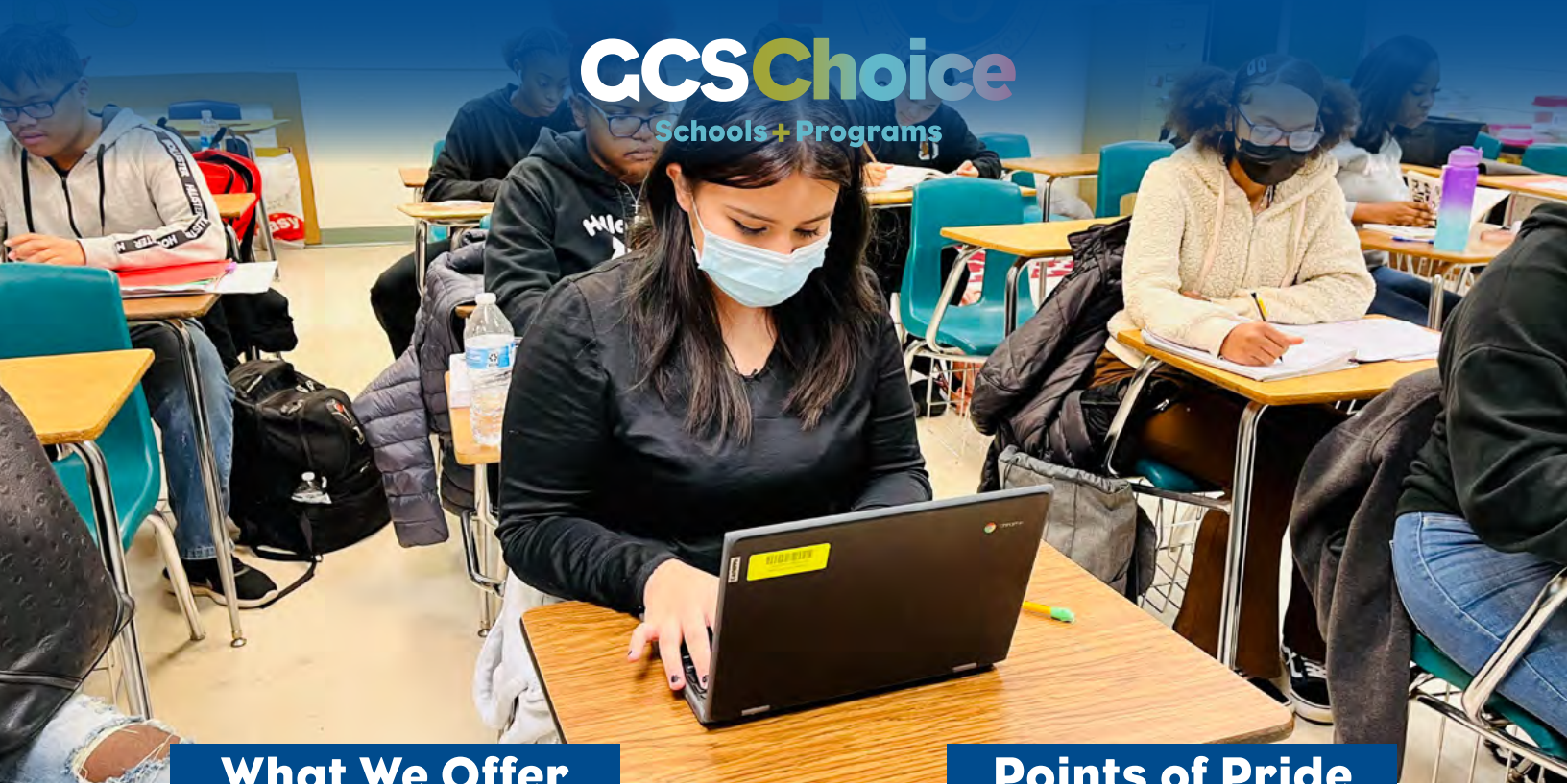
Mission

Smith HS is a majority-minority comprehensive high school with a student population of approximately 1,400 students. 97% of our students are students of color (55% Black, 27% Hispanic, 10% Asian, 5% Other, 3% White). When our students go home, they are exposed to over 60 different foreign languages spoken in the homes of our students. We are a Title 1 High School with over 85% of our families eligible to receive Free & Reduced Student Lunch. We are also a Restart High School under the GCS Opportunity Culture Initiative.
