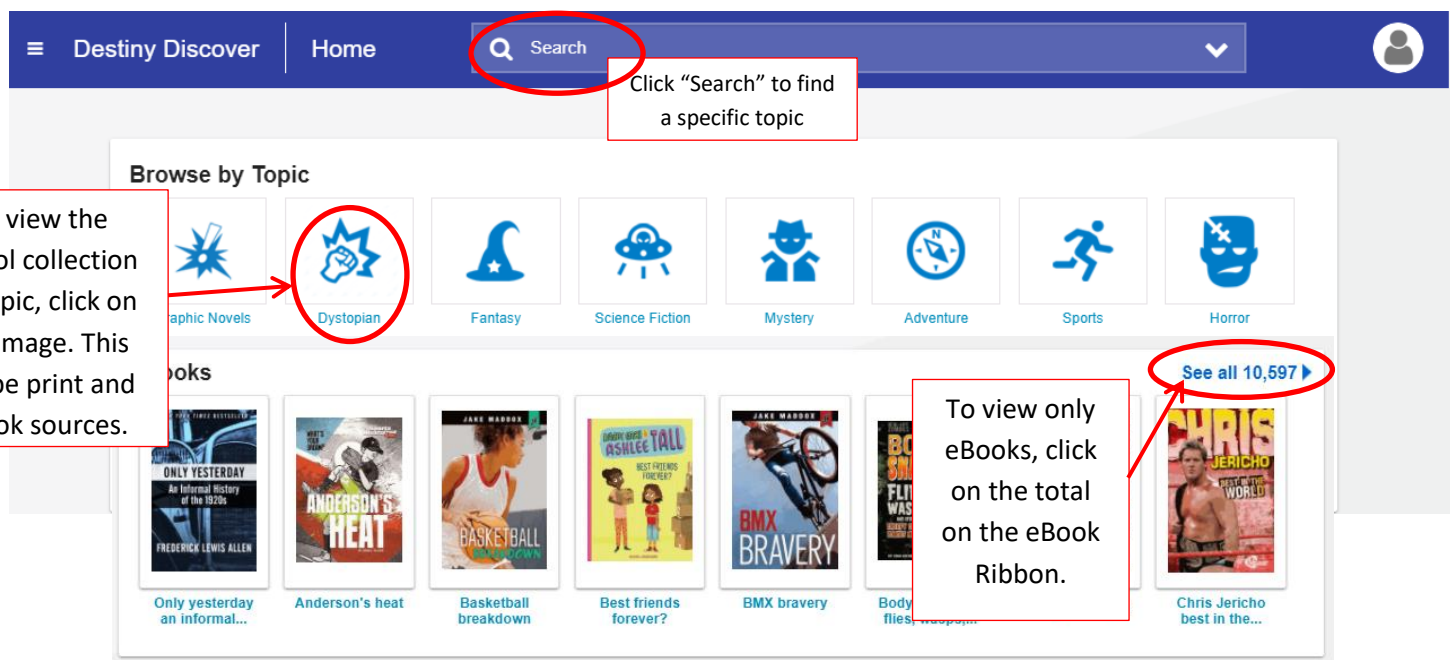
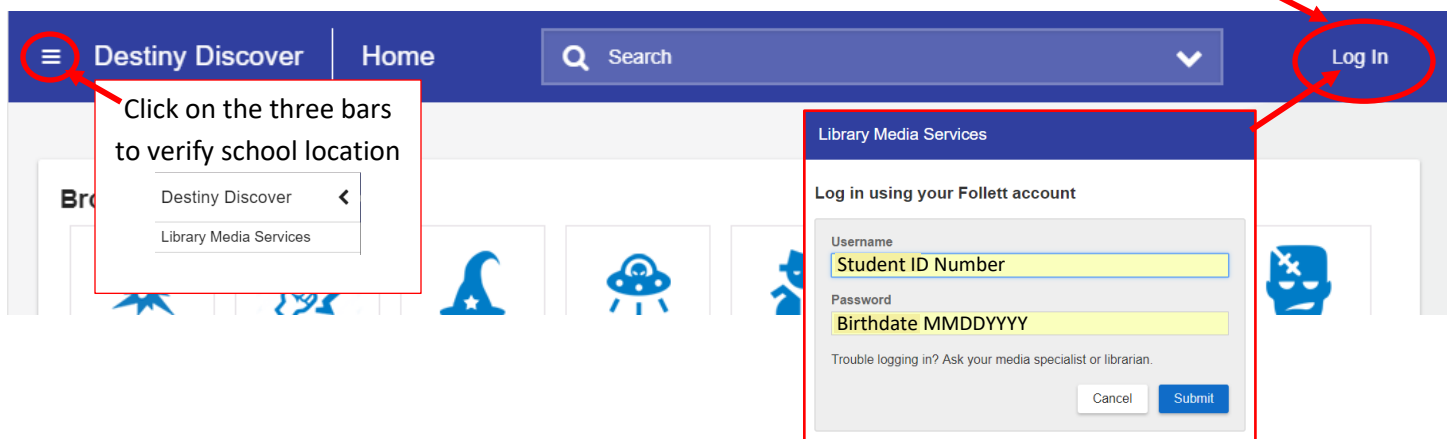
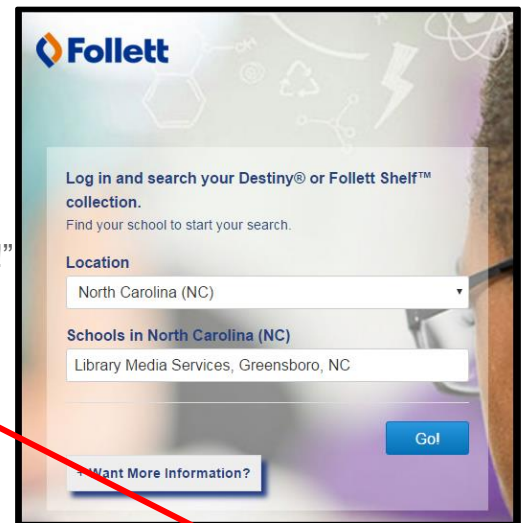


Logging into the GCS eBook Shelf

- **Step 1:** (Students & Teachers can only log into their schools site).
 - go to www.gofollett.com
- **Step 2:** Select your Location (North Carolina)
- **Step 3:** Type your School Name, Select your school, and click "Go!"
 - Students must select their current school until August 1
- **Step 3:** Click "**Login**" in the upper right corner of the screen. **Enter the students login information**
 USERNAME: Student ID #
 PASSWORD: Birthday (mmddyyyy)
 - Make sure the student's school is in the upper corner.
 - STAFF log-ins UN: email username PW: email username
