The systemic barrier has been removed.




Support Systems in Place:

- 1st Block (One Hour)
 - Rotation/Academic Support/Foundations
- Senior Seminar
 - Along with One or Two College Classes
- Leadership
 - Along with Multiple College Classes
- Tutoring
 - Before and/or After School
- IEP, 504, and EL Support

Academics:

- High School Classes
- Possible College Classes:
 - Qualify with test scores, grades, attendance, behavior, attitude
- College Credentials Possible:
 - Associates of Arts
 - Associates of Science
 - Diploma or Certificate Programs in Specific Areas/Skills





Celebrations and Social Activities:

- Prom (Pre-COVID...hope again):
 - For ALL students of all grade levels.
 - Joint event with other Early/Middle Colleges and Academies.

Academic Opportunities:

- Goal:
 - All students to graduate from high school.
 - Positive and supportive atmosphere
- Ultimate Goal:
 - Students graduate with high school diploma PLUS at least some college classes.
 - Some students will graduate in four or five years with an additional college credential.
- Earn the right to take college classes:
 - At least one high school class along with college classes

2021 Graduation Data:

- Four Year Graduation Rate: 100%
- ACT Average Score: 19.92
- Math Course Rigor Proficiency: 100%
- Post Secondary Plans of Graduates: (59 Graduates)
 - Four Year College/University: 54%
 - Community College: 31%
 - Military: <1%
 - Employment: 15%
- Distinctions earned by Class of 2021 Graduates:
 - 33 Graduated with NC Diploma and numerous college transfer credits
 - 26 Graduated with their NC Diplomas PLUS an Associates Degree
 - 14 NC Academic Scholars
