





Items That Are NOT Acceptable

Bandanas

Barefeet

Blankets

Gang paraphernalia

Bedroom Shoes

Belly Shirts/ Crop tops

Hats/ Headscarves/ Stockings caps/ Durags

Hoods off heads in building and classrooms

Non-medical masks, face covering, or garments that cover the student's face or conceal the student's identity

Shirts longer than shorts

Socks without footwear

Pajamas/ Loungewear

Hair Bonnets/ Shower Caps

Tank/racer-back tops/ open back

(Tanks = 3 finger width straps)

Transparent clothing

Visible undergarments

Sagging pants (Pants are to rest on top of hip bones with no underclothing showing)

Graduation Requirements







Total 22 credits to Graduate

4 English – I, II, III, IV

4 Math – I, II, III, additional math

4 Histories – Civic Literacy, World History, American History, and Economics & Personal Finance

3 Science – Biology, Earth Science and Physical Science (Chemistry)

1PE/Health (Pass CPR) 6 Electives 2 World Languge if going straight to 4-year college after high school



CPR Required



Grade 9 > 10 Minimum of 5 credits cumulative must be earned

Grade 10 > 11 Minimum of 10 credits cumulative must be earned

Grade 11 > 12 Minimum of 16 credits must be earned

Graduation - Minimum of 22 credits and successful completion of any other state standards must be earned





Grading Scales

$$A = 90 - 100$$

$$B = 80 - 89$$

$$C = 70 - 79$$

$$D = 60 - 69$$

F = 59 and below











GPA calculates twice per year – once after 1st semester and then again after 2nd semester



Includes all final grades from 9th grade moving forward



Grades are recorded on your transcript, which is what is sent to colleges as a part of the admissions determination process




- Make your high school goals about more than just graduation
- Prepare yourself to be successful in your postsecondary efforts










Tips for Parent Success






The Stress of Senior Year...


