HONORS PROGRAMS:

Honors courses go into greater depth and have a more rigorous curriculum. Page has an open enrollment policy for Honors and AP courses. Enrollment in the IB Program is by application for full diploma candidates. Students may enroll in select IB courses per teacher recommendation for certificate credit. AP/IB courses are weighted on a 5-point scale, Honors courses on a 4.5-point scale, and all other courses on a 4-point scale for the class of 2024. Some courses are not offered every year since offerings require a minimum enrollment.

Last year at Page, our students took a total of 1302 Advanced Placement Exams from the various AP courses we offer. The Classes of 2002 through 2023 included 42 National Merit semifinalists.

THE INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM:

Page is a certified International Baccalaureate world school, offering nearly three dozen sections of different IB courses in all disciplines. Many of our students have taken on the IB Challenge; our current senior class includes nearly 41 members completing their IB Diploma, 49 juniors engaged full time in IB courses, and additionally we have numerous students working towards IB Certificate status. Results on IB exams are released in July.

CREDIT AND GRADUATION INFORMATION:

Page operates on a traditional schedule offering 7 credits over the period of a year. Periods are 50 minutes in length. Multiple credits are awarded for classes meeting for more than one period daily. Credit is granted at the end of the course and is based on the final course grade. To receive a Future Ready Core College/University Preparatory Diploma, 2024 graduates must complete 22 Carnegie required units: 4 units of English, 4 units of math, 4 units of social studies, 3 units of science (all science courses have a lab component), 2 units of the same foreign language, and 1 unit of physical education/health. Students are also required to take the four-state mandated end-of-course tests: Math I, Math III, English II, and Biology. Students must also successfully complete CPR.

RANK IN CLASS:

On the transcript, Page High School provides grade point average and numerical rank. GPA for the class of 2024 is determined using a 4-point scale for regular courses, a 4.5-point scale for Honors courses, and a 5-point scale for AP/IB/Dual Enrollment courses. In computing GPA, all students and all courses are included.

Page High School serves the northern sector of Greensboro, which includes older established neighborhoods and new suburban areas. Page students are from diverse economic, religious, racial, and national backgrounds.
