Exam Time

For 8:00 AM Exam, please arrive at the testing site no later than 7:45 AM. Exams will start promptly at 8:00 AM. For 12:00 PM exams, you must arrive at the testing site by 11:45 AM. Exams vary in length. AP exams usually take four hours to complete. There will be some time added to the beginning and ending of exams for administrative processes. All students must be present at the beginning and throughout an AP exam.

Cell Phones and Electronic Devices

Test integrity and security is of utmost importance to the College Board. Under no circumstance should a cell phone, iPod, MP3 Player, or any other recording device be in the testing room. A cell phone, iPod, MP3 Player, or any other recording device in a student's

possession will constitute a misadministration and the student must retake the exam. You would be required to reimburse the cost of the exam in the case of a misadministration.

Calculators

A graphing calculator is necessary if students are taking the AP Calculus AB exam. Students may bring up to two calculators to these exams, but they may not share calculators. Be sure to check your calculator batteries. You are encouraged to have fresh batteries in your calculator for the exam. Do not bring a calculator with a QWERTY keyboard. Check www.collegeboard.com/ap/calculators for the most updated listing of approved calculators. If you are unsure if your calculator meets AP requirements, please check with your teacher prior to the test.

What to Bring to the Exam Room

- ✓ A valid photo identification
- ✓ Several sharpened No. 2 pencils
- ✓ Pens with black ink
- ✓ A watch (that does not make noise)
- ✓ Up to two approved calculators with the necessary functions
- ✓ Extra batteries
- ✓ Tissues if you think you'll need them

What NOT to Bring to the Exam Room

- ✓ Cell phones.
- ✓ iPods or any other electronic or communication devices
- ✓ Books, compasses, colored pencils, correction fluid, highlighters or notes
- ✓ Computers
- ✓ Watches that beep or have an alarm
- ✓ Portable listening or recording devices or photographic equipment
- ✓ Food or drink
- ✓ Clothing with subject-related information

How will my scores be communicated to my college?

For an AP exam, students will mark on their first answer sheet which college or university they would like to have their AP exam scores sent. The College Board will send ALL this year's and previous years' scores to the university that you indicate for free.

When will exam scores be available?

AP® students will get their scores online in July. To access their scores online, students must follow the steps outlined below.

- **Fill in** AP answer sheets carefully and consistently at exam time or during a pre-administration session. It is especially important to provide name, date of birth, sex, mailing address, and email address.
- **Sign up** for a College Board account on the **student AP score website** as early as possible. Students must have an account to access their scores.
 - Some students may already have an account. Have them confirm this by signing in.
- **Remember** the following information, which will be required to see scores in July:
 - College Board account username and password
 - 2021 AP number (or student ID number if they provided it on their AP answer sheet)

Score Release Schedule

The score release schedule will be available on the **student AP score website** in May, and students will receive an email in early July reminding them when they can access their scores. Without the AP number listed in the Student Pack you will not be able to communicate effectively with the College Board if issues arise after exams.
