A Peek at the Week

Math: This week in math we will be solving word problems using the standard addition algorithm and the standard subtraction algorithm with tape diagrams. Topic D quiz will be given on Tuesday.

Parent Tips

- Pose word problems to your child and ask him to solve them. For example, Mark typed 2,345 words on Monday and 3,867 words on Tuesday. How many words did Mark type altogether on Monday and Tuesday? Encourage your child to draw a tape diagram, to round to estimate an answer, and then to find the exact answer. Answers should be written as statements. Ask your child to assess the reasonableness of his answer. Does the answer make sense?
- Have your child get their belongings together the night before and set it out in a visible location. **Don't forget to bring charged Chrome Books back to school :)**
- Have your child find at least 2 similes or metaphors while reading.
- Help your child study for vocabulary quizzes
