What looks different for students?

Eureka math asks students to explain their thinking. This helps increase their understanding. Homework problems and tests will be more open-ended, and students will have to write to explain the thinking behind their answers.

All students will be receiving print workbooks. They will get three types of workbooks:

- **Learn:** In-class work and application problems
- **Practice:** In-class sprint and fluency activities
- **Succeed:** Homework problems accompanied by Homework Helpers for every assignment
 - Homework Helpers are example problems that are similar to the homework problems, but have already been solved and include all the steps used to solve the problems. Students will either bring home the Succeed book or pages from the book.
