We are super excited about Week #5 of SY21-22! Here are a few important updates and reminders.

### **Instruction**

The week of September 12 is a normal instructional week. As a reminder, the instructional day begins at 9:20 AM each day. Please do not drop your student off before 9:00 AM each day as we need to ensure there is appropriate supervision for our students at all times.

Students that arrive after 9:20 am will be marked tardy, receive a phone call home, and multiple tardies will result in an impact to their attendance record and student event participation.

For clarity, the testing dates for NWEA Measures of Academic Progress for the Fall Semester will be announced in a future ConnectEd and on our website. Those dates have not been announced yet. Please encourage your student to take this diagnostic seriously, as we want to ensure that we are able to support the academic progress of all of our students and this diagnostic is one of the ways we are able to accomplish this goal.

Beginning next week, parents at each grade level will begin receiving a newsletter outlining the standards that students are working on each week along with celebrations of student academic achievement. ### **Early Dismissal:**

**Early dismissal begins at 2:30 PM each day, and only then with prior notice to the front office.**

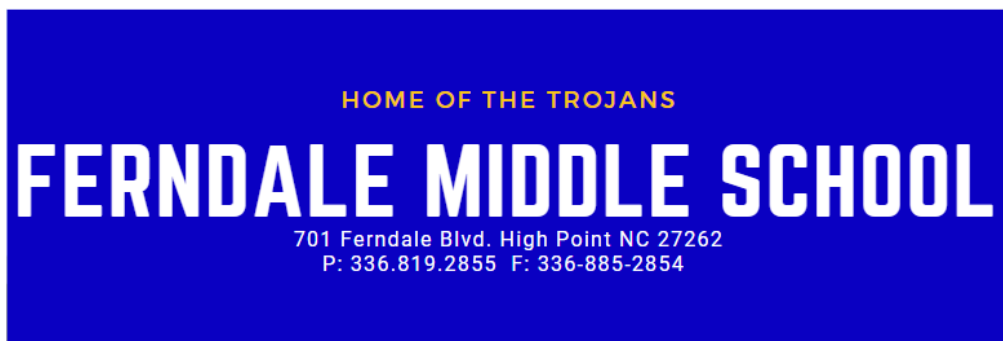

## **OneCard**

Our school will be transitioning to the use of One Card this week. Once issued their OneCard, students will be able to board the bus, enter the building, and be counted for attendance purposes daily. All students will be required to have their OneCard with them daily at the beginning of the instructional day in order to board the bus. ### **Nutrition:**

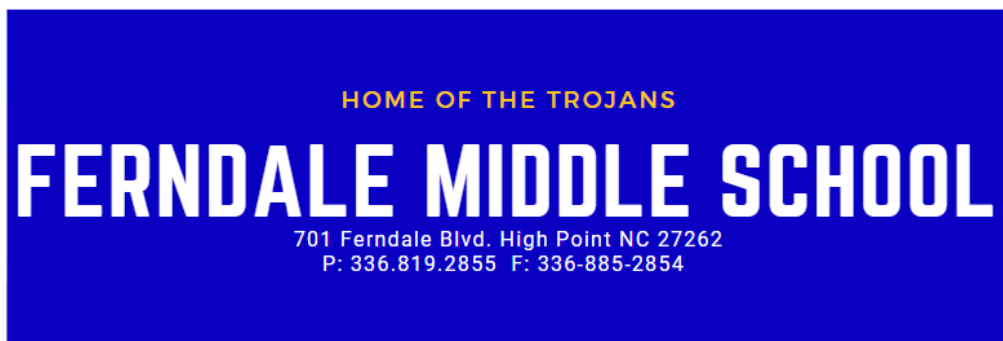
Breakfast will be served daily from 9:00 AM to 9:20 AM and is free for all students. Lunch will be served daily according to each grade level schedule.
