We are super excited about Week #6 of SY21-22! Here are a few important updates and reminders for this week.

Response to Choice:

TikTok Challenge: Devious Licks

We are listing this topic first this week to address a very serious concern. There is currently a challenge being published on TikTok that encourages students to destroy and to steal school property called the Devious Licks Challenge. This is a serious issue. Our school has suffered damage as a result. Any student found engaging in this challenge is taking part in the violation of the Guilford County Schools Student Code of Conduct. Disciplinary responses will be administered accordingly. Please help us encourage our students to not engage in this behavior, and instead to have pride for their school and the building.

Bus Behaviors

As the school year progresses, we would like to ask for your help in partnering with us to ensure that students understand the importance of adhering to bus rules. Students should remain seated at all times, remain distanced in their seats for safety, and adhere to the instructions of the bus drive at all times. Any non-adherence to the bus driver rules will result in a disciplinary response that could include suspension from the bus.

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Instruction

The week of September 12 is a normal instructional week. As a reminder, the instructional day begins at 9:20 AM each day. Please do not drop your student off before 9:00 AM each day as we need to ensure there is appropriate supervision for our students at all times.

Students that arrive after 9:20 am will be marked tardy, receive a phone call home, and multiple tardies will result in an impact to their attendance record and student event participation.

Testing

NWEA Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) testing will begin the week of 9/27. The testing schedule will be posted to our website this week. MAP, or the Measure of Academic Progress, is a computerized adaptive test which helps teachers, parents, and administrators improve learning for all students and make informed decisions to promote a child's academic growth. Please encourage your student to take this test seriously, as we want to ensure that we are able to support the academic progress of all of our students and this is one of the ways we are able to accomplish this goal.

Newsletters

Beginning this week, parents at each grade level will begin receiving a newsletter outlining the standards that students are working on each week along with celebrations of student academic achievement. Please ensure that we have the most current email address for you so that you may

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receive this information. You may send your most recent email to Principal Caesar-Crawford at caesarl@gcsnc.com.

Early Dismissal:

Early dismissal begins at 2:30 PM each day, and only then with prior notice to the front office. Early dismissal for students will be permitted for medical reasons and student or family emergencies, etc. Excessive early dismissals will result in a letter sent home and require a meeting with the Principal. It should also be noted that any dismissal before 1pm each day is considered an absence (as all students must be in school for at least half a day in order to be marked present.)

Safety:

We want to strongly reiterate, that students exhibiting any symptoms such as fever, cough, weakness, headache, etc. should NOT be sent to school. If a student exhibits these symptoms during the school day, the student will be isolated until a parent can pick them up.

All students and staff are REQUIRED to wear masks at all times in class and common areas in the building. If you are in need of a medical waiver form to exempt your student, please contact the Front Office and we can arrange to have a form sent home.

On September 7, I sent a separate ConnectEd message regarding the protocol for the district and schools to report positive COVID-19 cases. Please refer to the Guilford County Schools website Reopening of Schools Q&A document for further information at www.gcsnc.com/reopening.

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Athletics

If your student has tried out and has been selected to play a sport in our athletics program this year, please be reminded of two things:

- If they are unvaccinated, your student will have to undergo COVID-19 testing and that testing schedule/information will be shared in future communications.
- Your student must maintain specific academic and behavioral expectations in order to continue to participate.

Immunizations:

Parents of Grade 7 students are reminded that your student must have the TDAP booster and MCV Vaccine before the school year begins. **The deadline for this vaccination was September 16.** Your student will not be allowed to attend school after this date without proof of the immunization. If you are contacted to ensure that your student has received the immunization, please ensure that you have the appropriate documentation to submit with your student this week.

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Transportation

If you are experiencing transportation issues at this time with an assignment you have already been provided, please contact our front office and we will be happy to assist you. If you have made a transportation request as recently as last week, it will take up to 10 days to fulfill this request. For further assistance with transportation see below:

<u>Here Comes the Bus</u> – Provides student bus assignment, GPS tracking of the bus arrival for pick up. <u>School Bus Locator</u> – Provides parents access to view bus route information, student ID and birthdate are required to log in. Bus information will only exist if a request has been submitted. <u>Parent Portal</u> – PowerSchool Transportation tab contains student bus assignment information.

School bus stop appeal - allows parents to request a change to their student's bus stop.

OneCard

Our school will be transitioning to the use of One Card this month. Once issued their OneCard, students will be able to board the bus, enter the building, and be counted for attendance purposes daily. All students will be required to have their OneCard with them daily at the beginning of the instructional day in order to board the bus. Informational flyers will be sent home this week with more information for parents. This information will also be sent posted on our website.

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Technology:

If your Grade 8 student was issued a device in previous school years and has not returned it to school this year, please ensure that they return it this week. They will have the chance to return it in homeroom.

Cell Phones:

A reminder that the use of cell phones for purposes other than an approved instructional activity are strictly prohibited. Parents, please remind students that they are to keep their cell phones in their backpacks during the school day unless instructed otherwise by a teacher or administrator that it can be used for instructional purposes. Non-adherence to this policy will result in a disciplinary action.

Front Office Hours:

Our Front Office phones are answered between the hours of 8:45 AM and 4:45 PM. Our office number is 336-819-2855.

Nutrition:

Breakfast will be served daily from 9:00 AM to 9:20 AM and is free for all students. Lunch will be served daily according to each grade level schedule.

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Car Riders:

To keep our car rider line moving in the morning, please ensure that students have their masks on, bookbags sealed, OneCards ready, and are prepared to exit the vehicle as quickly as possible. Please do not stop or park your vehicle in the car rider line. Parking is available in surrounding areas of the school lot.

Grade 6 and 7 parents may pick up students in the car rider line in the front entrance of the school.

Grade 8 parents may pick up students in the car rider line in the front of the Grade 8 annex of the school.
