ACADEMIC OPPORTUNITIES

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Good attendance is essential for student achievement and success. Students must attend a 45-minute extra help session for each absence over 3 in a class period in a nine weeks period. It is the responsibility of the student on the first day of his/her return to school following an absence to arrange for make-up time and/or work. All assigned make-up work will be completed outside of regular class time within 3 school days (except in the case of consecutive multiple absences).
