



Grade 11th > 12th Minimum of 16 credits must be earned


Graduation - Minimum of 22 credits and successful completion of any other state standards must be earned

1 PE/Health (Pass CPR) 6 Electives 2 World Language if going straight to 4-year college after high school (Spanish, Latin & French)








## Test Participation




# GTCC College and career Promise Program (CCP)

Career and College Promise offers North Carolina high school students the chance to earn college credits at a community college campus. The program is tuition-free for high school juniors and seniors (semester fees will apply). You must have a cumulative unweighted GPA of 2.8 or higher or passing test scores.

### **Students can earn:**

- College credit transferable to all <u>UNC System Institutions</u> and many of <u>NC's</u>
   <u>Independent Colleges and Universities</u>
- A credential, certificate or diploma in a technical career
- A high school diploma and two years of college credit in four to five years through innovative cooperative high schools (limited availability).
