

Dear Parent/Guardian:

This letter provides important information regarding the 2024-2025 course registration process at Southeast Guilford High School. The information below and resources included will help guide decisions about your student's course requests and help your student reach the next stage of academic progress.

The following documents will help you and your student make course requests for the 2024-2025 school year. The following items are included:

- Pre-Registration Worksheet
- Southeast Guilford Course Offerings: Outlines course offerings available to students for the 2024-2025 school year.
- State and Local Requirements for High School Graduation from Guilford County Schools High School Registration Handbook: This guide will help you understand what courses you need to graduate and allow you to see your progress towards that goal.
- Tentative Weaver Academy Course Offerings: Keep in mind that a student must take two courses at Weaver, so please pick two courses if you want to attend Weaver Academy.
- College and Career Promise eligibility information.

Your student can register for course requests online. The registration window will open for student access from March 1st to March 10th. Parents/guardians may review their son's/daughter's 2024-2025 course requests by accessing the PowerSchool Parent Portal. You may find the parent portal on our school's webpage by clicking the Parent tab. As soon as the district provides instructions on this process, we will make that available to you.

Counselors will begin meeting in-person with students during 2nd block, starting the week of February 12th. During this time, counselors will work to ensure that students are meeting graduation requirements and taking advantage of the most rigorous coursework available to them. Second block teachers will know the exact date that their class will register, so please make sure your student is aware and has the pre-registration worksheet completed by the appropriate day. Students should return their pre-registration worksheet to their 2nd block teacher prior to their registration date.

When counselors meet with students, it is best for the Pre-Registration Worksheet to be signed by the parent. However, counselors will continue registering a student's courses for next school year, even if the worksheet is not signed. It will be an assumed signature and course selections are accessible to parents for review in May.

Career and College Promise Courses at GTCC (Dual Enrollment)

- 1. Career and College Promise Program is open to eligible North Carolina high school students in order to accelerate completion of college certificates, diplomas, and associate degrees that lead to college transfer or provide entry-level job skills.
- 2. Eligible junior and seniors are allowed 4 tuition free semesters at GTCC if they enter at the beginning of their junior year and enroll in college classes for the next 4 consecutive semesters (not including summer). Home school students must be making academic progress towards graduation and reclassification of homeschool transcripts is prohibited.
- 3. Students may be responsible for all textbooks, fees and supplies.
- 4. Students will receive college semester credit hours, which will apply toward college graduation and/or transfer.
- 5. All coursework at GTCC becomes part of your permanent academic history. Grades received and/or excessive drops may have implications involving future financial assistance, athletic eligibility, probation, etc.
