More than 14,000 GCS students qualify as academically gifted, and a recent analysis by *The Charlotte News and Observer* found that GCS has the smallest disparity between low-income and high-income students in the state when it comes to identifying those academic talents through a combination of test scores, teacher and parent referrals and academic performance.

ACADEMICALLY GIFTED OPPORTUNITIES AT EVERY AGE

K-2nd Grade: Consultative services for students and teachers.

2nd-3rd Grade: Nurturing critical and creative thinking through regular classroom visits by AG teachers.

3rd-5th Grade: AG-identified students receive pull-out enrichment services and other advanced learners receive talent development services to maximize academic potential.

Middle School: Students have the option of taking advanced or accelerated courses in math and English/ Language Arts.

High School: Rigorous advanced coursework is available to all students through Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate and dual-enrollment programs.
